

Geneva Combines Enter Sectional Indoor Carnival

Geneva High's minor sports teams will compete for Sectional N.Y.S.P.H.S.A.A. indoor sports carnival at Rochester Section Five laurels in swimming, wrestling and bowling in the this weekend.

The 13th annual Sectional swimming meet will stage team preliminaries at 3 p. m. Saturday at John Marshall High School, with the finals slated for the same tank at 8 p. m.

Coach Merrill Braymen's Geneva squad will enter Jack Shone, Dale Johnson, Charlie Dunham and David Paul in the fancy diving; Colin Morehouse in the 100-yard breaststroke, Ken Seely and Curt Serven in the 50-yard freestyle, Al Bartlett and Dom Bruno in the 100-yard backstroke, and a medley relay team composed of Lyman King, Dave Babcock and George Schleeauf.

Marshall High, gunning for its sixth straight team title, will be defending its 200-yard relay title. Marshall holds an unbroken tank win streak of 60 straight dual meets. Jefferson High of Rochester is the defending champion in the 150-yard medley relay.

The Canandaigua doubles pair of Woodhams and Vitalone bested the Geneva combine of Ray Tundie and Sam Sarratori, who compiled 501 and 368 respectively. Their 869 total was far short of the county seat duo's 1,006.
