

Fredonia Wrestlers Win Six Individual Titles

Fredonia High School wrote "finis" to the first wrestling season in its history by winning six out of the 12 events in the county wrestling meet held in the local gymnasium on Saturday.

Although no official team score was kept, unofficial records showed that the Hillbillies garnered 30

points on the basis of five points for a pin and three for a decision. With three pins Mayville, regular season champion, captured second place with 15 points, while Falconer scored 13 on two pins and a decision. Brocton's team, which numbered only two men, failed to get a single victory.

Twenty-eight boys participated in the tournament which was run off in the afternoon and evening. Many Fredonia grapplers were awarded a bye in the afternoon eliminations because of lack of opponents. However, only one, Don Mesel, won his final match by default. Mesel had no opposition in the 120-pound class.

In only two of the 12 evening finals did no Fredonia wrestlers participate. In these Dick Shoup of Falconer pinned Merlin Hall of Mayville in the 145-pound division, while Dick Rodgers scored a fall over Joe Hansen in the 154-pound class.

Fredonia's victories were by Frank DeJohn, Stennett Miller, John Black, Bob Mesel and Bob Lehnen.
