With Some Persuasion

Varsity Happy It Added Wrestling to Athletic Budget

Not all colleges can find room in their athletic budgets for wrestling. With some persuasion, University of Rochester found room this winter and is glad of it.

Interest in intercollegiate wrestling on the River Campus was planted with an intramural grappling seed a few years ago.

Then came the persuasion with Bruce Brown, now a junior, and Warren Carlaugh, a graduated football player, the salesman. They petitioned the UR athletic committee to be included in the budget.

Jim Modrak and Jim Cargnoni, both former Rochester Institute of Technology wrestlers, were engaged as coaches. When Varsity defeated University of Buffalo on its first intercollegiate try last weekend, the interest in the sport zoomed.

College wrestling crowds are seldom big, but the turnout of 250 on hand for the

match with Colgate last Wednesday whooped it up.

Modrak hopes he can bring his grapplers along gradually, using this year for the groundwork and looking for big improvement next season. Half his squad never competed in high school wrestling.

Elmer Burnham coach of the unbeaten UR football team, views wrestling with special glee. He sees the sport as a fine off-season conditioner. "Builds up those arms and legs," Elmer says.

Two footballers, Tom McGuire and Don Haeffe, are members of the grappling squad. Haeffe wrestled at Marshall High, but McGuire, formerly of Aquinas Institute, only has been at the sport for four weeks.

Varsity is 1-1 for the season and will resume its schedule Jan. 10 at Hamilton. Then will follow matches with Alfred, Union, Hobart (2) and RPI.
