

# W-FL Mat Champs Turn Attention to Section 5

## Five Genevans Win to Cop Loop Tourney; Waterloo, Canandaigua Share Second Spot

Twelve newly crowned Wayne-Finger Lakes conference wrestling champions today turned their attention toward still another honor today after the Geneva High Panthers had proved their right to be champions of the conference.

Interest turns quickly to the Section 5 tournament which begins this week for both the Class A and Class B schools with eight of the nine conference members hoping to push through someone to championships. Union Springs, a member of the W-FL, is in Section 4.

The five Class B members of the league begin tournament action early with pre-quarterfinals set at three schools to determine quarterfinalists for the action at Mynderse Academy, Saturday.

Tomorrow night, at Penn Yan, the host Mustangs will be joined by Odessa and Dundee for a 6 p.m. match. Wednesday night, action will take place at Waterloo, for the host Indians and Mynderse Academy, Victor and two entries from Bloomfield, while at the same time, at Wayne Central, Phelps and Marion join the host school. Bouts in both events will begin at 6 p.m.

The 12 survivors in each pre-quarterfinal, will then advance to the quarterfinals at Mynderse at 6 p.m., Saturday. Semi-finals at 2 p.m. and finals at 7:30 p.m. will be held March 2 at Attica.

The league's three Class A teams, Geneva, Canandaigua and Newark, will be joined by Batavia for the quarterfinal action at Geneva Junior High School at 2 p.m., Saturday, with the 12 survivors advancing to the semi-finals at 2 p.m. and the finals at 7:30 p.m. at Webster, March 2.

While the wrestlers are already working toward the sectional shields, the more than 500 fans

who jammed Geneva Junior High School, Saturday, are still talking about the close bouts in the finals that saw Geneva High cop five conference shields in winning easily, the tournament trophy to place alongside the league trophy.

The Panthers piled up 80 points to outdistance Waterloo and Canandaigua, tied for second place with 53 points. Waterloo finished second to Geneva in the number of champions with three while Canandaigua, Mynderse, Penn Yan and Wayne Central each had one winner.

Of the 12 newly crowned champions, only two are repeaters from last year. Gary Carpenter of Canandaigua, the 112 pound champ last year, won the 127 pound championship this year, by scoring a 1-0 decision over top seeded Scott Coapman of Union Springs. Dick Moore of Geneva got his third straight championship as he pinned Bob Pagano of Mynderse in 1:32.

All but the last match, won by Moore, were won by decisions and the widest margin of victory scored by any champion was four points.

In the 95 pound event, the decision wasn't reached until the final seconds. Jeff Parkman of Penn Yan and Larry Principio of Geneva battled almost three full periods to a scoreless tie when with 11 seconds to go, Principio escaped. But with four seconds left, Parkman scored a takedown and that won the match, 2-1.

At 103 pounds, Larry Principio scored a 3-0 win, scoring an escape and takedown in the second period for the only scoring.

Most exciting match of the tournament was at 112 pounds. George Lamson of Waterloo scored a takedown in the first period but Bob Monroe of Newark escaped. In the second period, Lamson gained a reversal but Monroe escaped and scored a takedown. Lamson reversed the situation again but again, Monroe escaped as Lamson held a 6-5 lead.

In the third period, Monroe gained a reversal for a 7-6 lead but Lamson picked up an extra point for riding time and that sent the match into overtime where Lamson scored a reversal and predicament for four points in the first period and then held on to win though Monroe gained a reversal in the second overtime period.

Joe Capone of Waterloo won the 120 pound match when he scored a reversal in the third period to break a 3-3 tie against Nick Zona of Mynderse.

At 127 pounds, it was scoreless until the final period when Carpenter of Canandaigua scored an escape from Scott Coapman of Union Springs for a 1-0 victory.

Pete Teichner of Geneva beat Dave Jensen of Waterloo by scoring a reversal in the second period and holding Jensen to a one point escape in the third period, Teichner winning the title with a 2-1 decision.

Ted Glass of Geneva, who scored the biggest upset of the tournament, coming from a fifth

seeding to knock off the fourth and first ranked wrestlers at 138, didn't stop until he had a championship when he scored takedowns in the first and second periods to beat Ray Kenny of Phelps, 4-1.

The match of the tournament came at 145 pounds where four well matched opponents had been pared down to just Nick Barbi of Mynderse and Walt Miller of Penn Yan.

Miller had an escape in the second period for a 1-0 lead but in the third period, he was caught with an illegal locking of hands to tie the match at 1-1. Barbi quickly scored an escape and the match ended with Barbi replacing Miller as the Finger Lakes champion, 2-1.

Dave VanGordon of Geneva also was assessed a penalty point but he had scored three points in the second period and beat Dick Davis of Canandaigua, 3-1.

Ralph Moak of Wayne Central scored two take-downs and an escape in the first two periods and went on to win a 5-1 victory over Joe Rollo of Geneva for the 165 pound crown.

In a fast, strong match, Jim Poorman of Waterloo and Dick Couch of Phelps battled to the wire. Poorman got a first period takedown, but in the second period, Couch escaped and scored a

takedown himself for a 3-2 lead that Poorman quickly tied up with an escape.

In the third period, Poorman reversed but Couch also reversed and with two seconds to go in the match, Poorman scored an escape and that gave him a 6-5 victory.

Of the 12 champions, six will be competing in the Class A tournament—Chuck Principio, Teichner, Glass, VanGordon and Moore of Geneva and Carpenter of Canandaigua. Six others will be battling in the Class B tourney—Lamson, Capone and Poorman of Waterloo; Barbi of Mynderse, Parkman of Penn Yan and Moak of Wayne.
