

# Auburn Wrestling Tourney Set for Wednesday at ACC With Seven Schools Entered

A total of seven area high schools will compete in the eighth annual Auburn Invitational Wrestling Tournament to be staged all day on Wednesday at Auburn Community College gymnasium.

Hank Vetter, director of athletics for the Auburn Public Schools and tournament director, announced today that Auburn will play host to Geneva, East Rochester, Oneida, West Genesee, Rome, and Rush-Henreita grappling teams.

Baldwinsville, last year's champions is not entered this year. East Rochester finished in the runnerup spot in 1965 while West Genesee was third and Auburn placed fourth. Rome was sixth and Oneida seventh.

Coach Dick Jones, coach of the Maroon matmen, reports that all six visiting teams have

strong clubs and the outcome of the tournament is a toss up at this point. Rush-Henreita is the only newcomer in the tourney but they are rated with the top mat teams in the Rochester area.

The wrestlers will weigh-in between 8:30 and 10 a.m. Wednesday. A seeding meeting to which all coaches are invited will be held on Tuesday, Mr. Vetter stated.

The first round of wrestling will start at 10:30 a.m. with two mats busy at the same time. The consolations will start approximately at 1 p.m. with two mats again being used for the first round matches.

The semifinals of the tournament will start at 3 p.m. with activity on two mats in the ACC gymnasium. The consolation fi-

nals will follow immediately after the semifinals.

The grapplers will break for supper after these events and return to action at 6:30 p.m. with third place being decided in each weight classification.

The champions will get underway at 8 p.m. with just one mat being used.

Awards will be presented by the tournament director to the winning team, individual champions in each weight class and also to the outstanding wrestler in the tourney.

Director Vetter stated that adults will be admitted for one dollar and this entitles them to come and go as they please. The student price for the same preference will be 75 cents.

Coach Jones' squad is not too strong in the light weight classes but have enough ability and experience in the other divisions to be a contender for the crown. Auburn has won its own tournament on three previous occasions.

Undeafated Maroon matmen are Bill Mann, a 165-pounder, who has won four straight matches; Bill Sroka, a 180-pounder; Bob Simmonds, 127 pounds. Other AHS wrestlers have suffered only one setback in four meets.
