



Sophomore Mike O'Connell rides his Eastridge opponent hard. Mike took the State title at 98 pounds.




Captain Rick Barry displays the form that lead him to a perfect season and the State Championship title at 122 pounds.


The team lost its league matches early in the season.

primarily due to the inexperience of most members. In all three of its C·C loses, the final outcome was dependent upon the last match.



Pete Alano rides out his Cardinal Mooney opponent en route to a 13-0 victory.






JV grappler Mike Tuzzeo presses for a pin.
