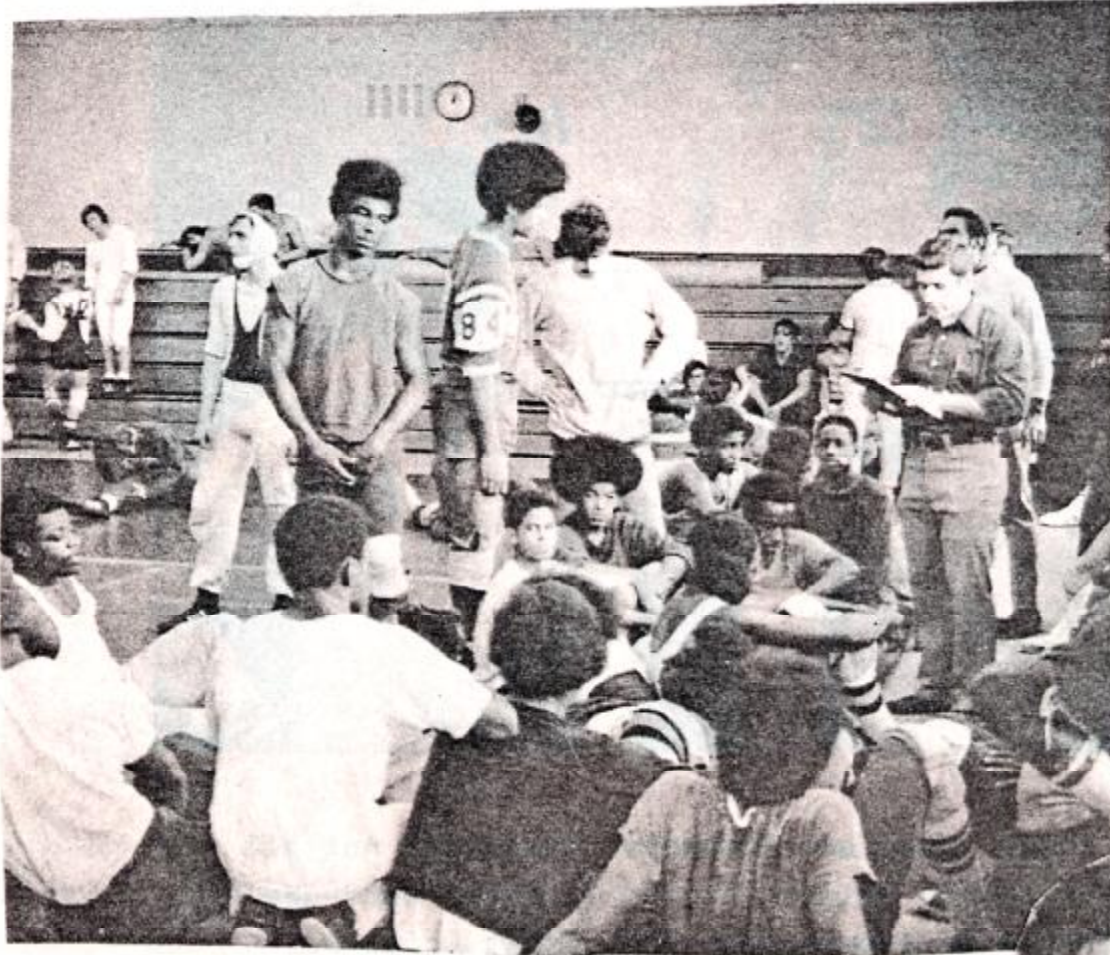

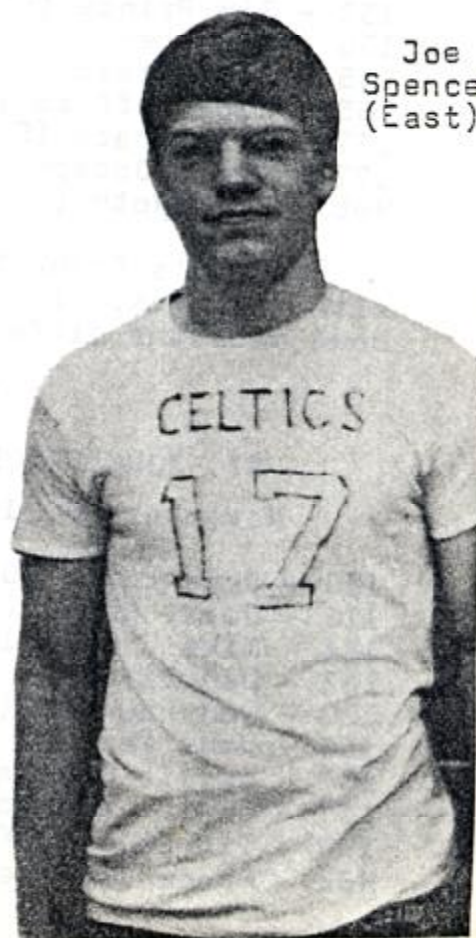

With a hefty nucleus of eight veterans back from last year's squad, St. John Fisher wrestling coach Mike Cronmiller is looking for a great season.

The young Cardinal team, which has only two seniors, bested tough Monroe Community College in a recent scrimmage, and seems a sure bet to improve on last season's 5-7 record.

"It looks like the makings of a tremendous team," Cronmiller says. "We've got a solid foundation of eight experienced men back, and some good-looking newcomers."

Team captain Emilio DiCataldo is back, and looks strong at 167 pounds. The Edison Tech. graduate posted a 6-3 mark last year. Another veteran, Mike O'Connell, piled up a 7-1 dual meet record at 126 pounds last season, and has moved up to 134 pounds this year.

Don and Dave Paukett hold down the 150 and 158 classifications. The Paukett brothers, graduates of Green High in Binghamton, were standouts for Fisher last season, led by Don's 7-3-1 record.

Jerry DeHey (8-3) at 126, John Lewis and Jimmy Reinhardt at 118, and Frank Valenti, 177, are the other returnees for Fisher.

A top newcomer is Tim Kolb at 190 pounds. A Penfield High graduate, Kolb placed second in the sectional tournament before coming to Fisher. Dan O'Conner, 117, Dan Listrani, 142, and Aldo Giovanni complete the squad.

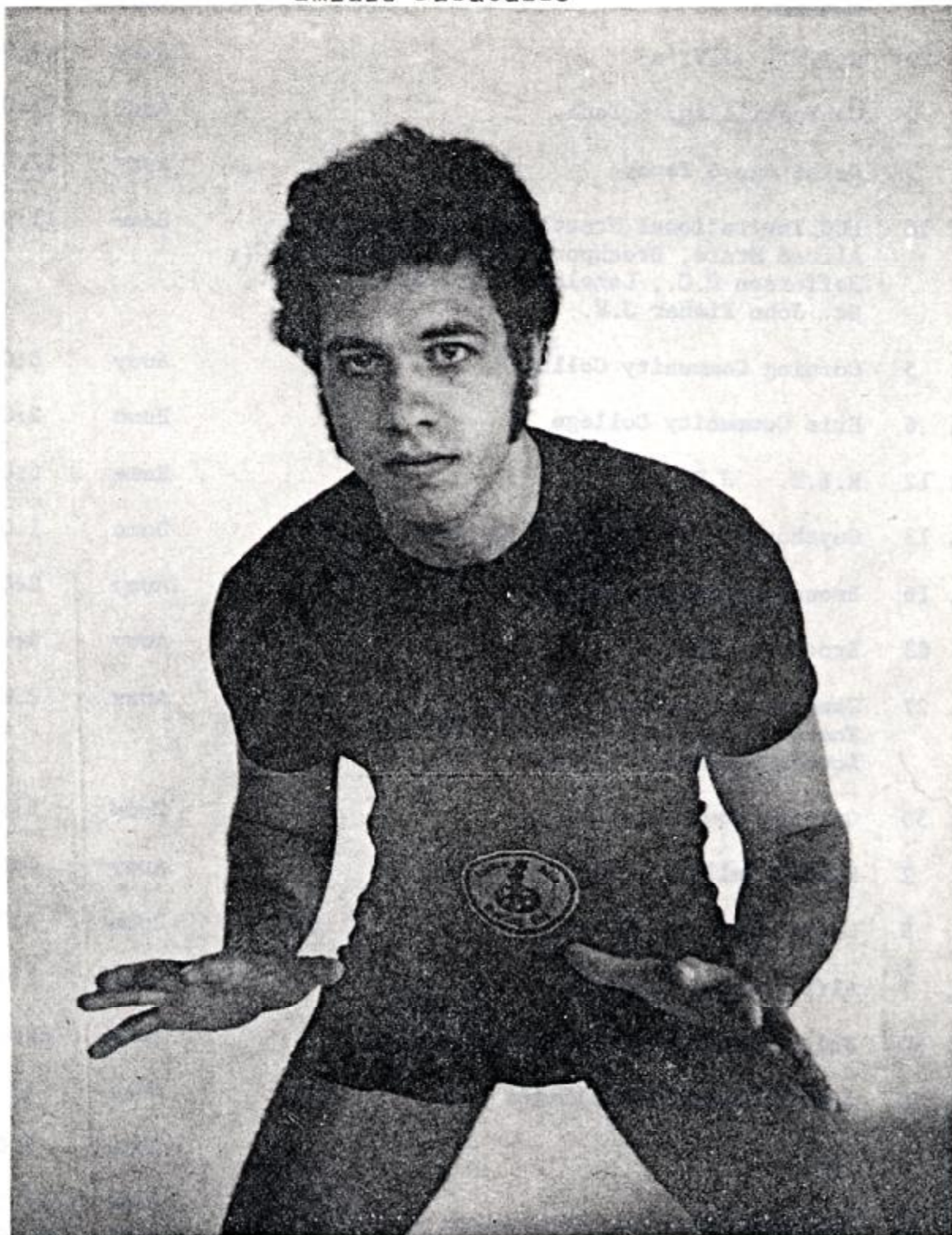

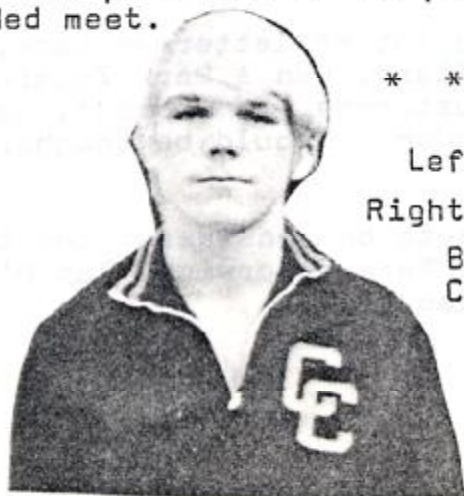
