

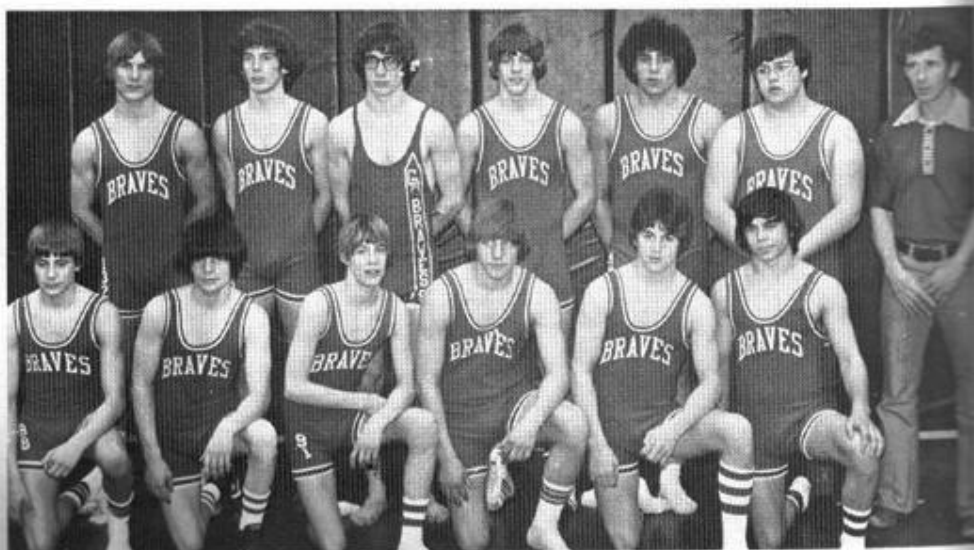
C.A. Matmen Continue League Domination

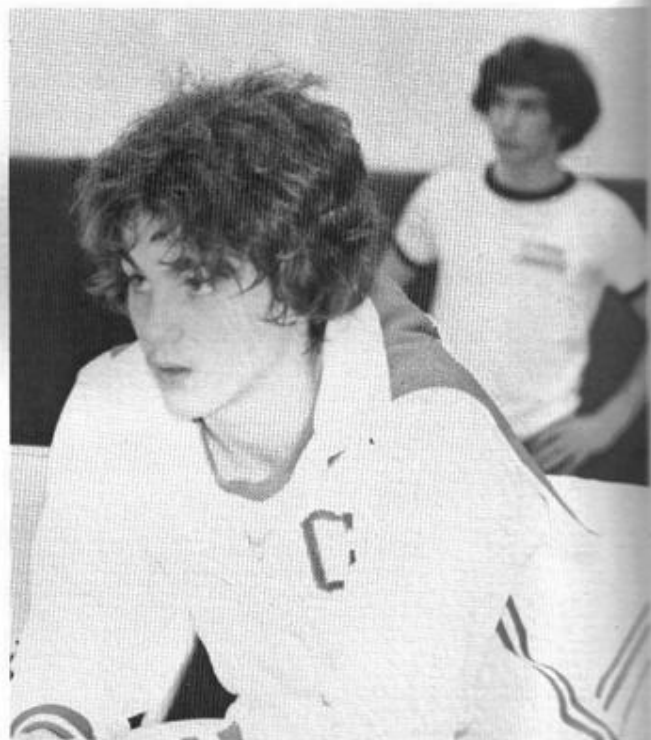
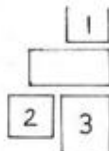

1—"These close matches are enough to make your hair curl," worries Coach Canough.

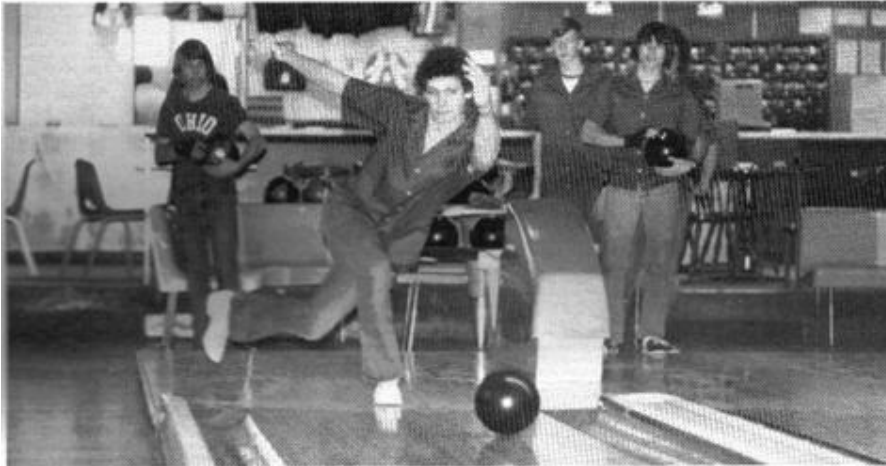

3—Matt King concentrates on the moves made by the opposition.



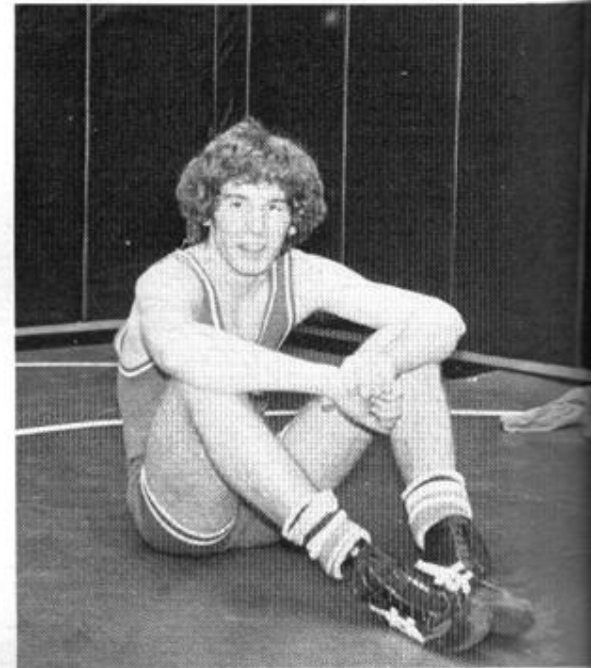
SECTION V

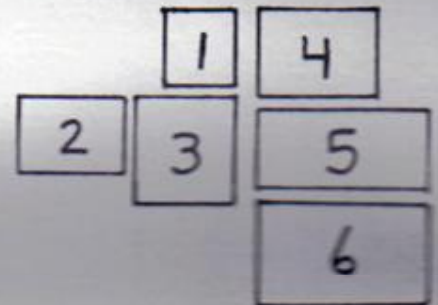
Wrestling (Team Championship)

Climbing the ladder of the state rankings for wrestling, the Braves reached an incredible fourth place standing!

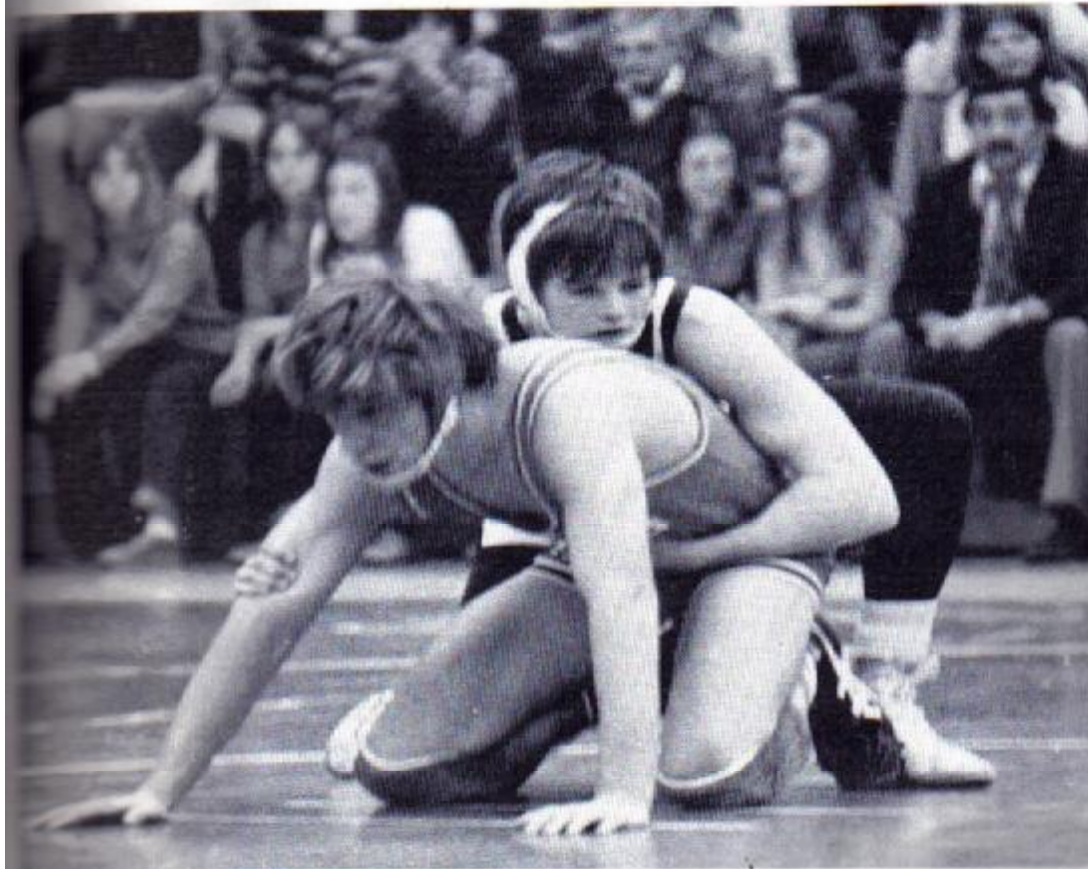
Dave Lynn also went to the finals of the State Tournament. He didn't win, but it was an exciting opportunity for him.
