Flashback: Rick Sadwick

Wins second state title to cap undefeated season; now attending Syracuse University

Imagine: You're in the state 155 pound finals facing a taller, stronger, faster, more aggressive wrestler from a section that has scored more points in the state than any other section. How do you beat him? You don't, unless your name is Rick Sadwick. He did just that, beating Kurt Lassen of Connetago, he became Section 5's third two-time state champion.

Think back: five seconds left in the last period of overtime. The match is notched at one each. At mat's edge, Sadwick executes a slick high-crotch double leg takedown. Lassen wildly scrambles to the boundary line to avoid the TD. By the ankles, Sadwick yanks him back inbounds and pounces on him for the winning takedownat the buzzer!

History lesson: How Sadwick's prowess developed. Older brother Greg created this monster on wrestling mats in the family's basement when Rick was an eighth grader. That year he was 6-0. As a freshman varsity wrestler, he went 13-14 and discovered that losing was not fun. So he started winning. As a tenth grader, he may have gone to the states if not for eventual state champ Rick Suhr of Spencerport. That year, Suhr handed Sadwick three close defeats. Sadwick's sophomore record: 23-7.

As a junior, Rick took apart 38 opponents, losing only to Bill Stanbro of Johnson

Cauliflower Ear

How to prevent and treat this scourge by Tony Oliveri, M.S., P.T

Cauliflower ear continues to be a fairly common wrestling injury, although not nearly as prevalent or severe as in past years. Ear guards, of course, help to eliminate most of the problem. A wrestler can sustain a cauliflower ear (hematoma of the pinna) even when wearing headgear. This article will briefly discuss this problem, its prevention, and treatment.

What makes some wrestlers more prone to cauliflower ear? Some of the factors include headgear (or lack of), wrestling style, and how the person's body responds to trauma. Cauliflower ear can be the result of one blow to the ear, or several episodes which acutely or gradually result in breakdown of blood vessels and connective tissue between the skin and ear cartilage. This leads to swelling and sometimes infection. Either the swelling or the infection can partially destroy the cartilage, changing the appearance of the ear.

Prevention: The most common type of prevention is to wear earguards. It's important for the earguards to fit snuggly as even the friction between the ear and earguard can cause this injury. In addition, if an athlete finds he is prone to this injury, a very small amount of petroleum jelly or other skin lubricant on the ear will decrease the friction. Do not to use too much, because exposed body lubricants are illegal. Finally, a foam or felt "horseshoe" can be construct

Profile: Ithaca College

Goes 15-0 and takes 3rd in NCAA Div III behind National Champ Mike Cronmiller of Edison


If you obey the speed limits, Ithaca College is just about two hours from Rochester. It sits high atop South Hill, overlooking Cayuga Lake and Ithaca, the ultimate college town. The 400-acre campus is in Central New York's scenic Southern Tier, 4.5 hours by car from New York City and 3.5 hours from Buffalo.

Ithaca college is a private, coeducational college with a population of 5,700. It was founded about 100 years ago, and has a rich tradition of wrestling greats, including Jim Howard (two-time All American), Jack Stanbro (national runner-up), Orlando lacovelli (All American), and of course, Bob Marella (national runner-up). Marella later went on to "professional" wrestling, and became known as Gorilla Monsoon.

Six schools (academic programs) reside within the college - Allied Health Professions; Business; Communications; Health; Physical Education and Recreation; Humanities and Sciences; and Music. Within these areas are 90 degree programs and over 1400 courses.

Ithaca is an NCAA Division III school. This means that it offers no athletic scholar-ships. Division III teams do recruit, but under their charter, are not allowed to offer money in the form of athletic scholarships. By contrast, Division I schools do offer athletic scholarships, while Division II schools offer limited athletic scholarships. Ithaca does,

ed by your coach or trainer for extra padding inside the headgear.

Treatment: When an athlete suffers an acute cauliflower ear, an ice pack should be applied, along with compression using an elastic bandage. Remember to keep the ice on for only twenty minutes at a time. If the swelling isn't gone in 24 to 48 hours, go to a physician (MD) who can drain (aspirate) it and apply a compressive dressing which should be kept in place for 3 to 5 days. If the swelling goes untreated, it will coagulate and harden, forming scar tissue. Once hardened the only way to remove it is through surgery. Once treated, and if your doctor approves, you can still practice and compete with the compressive dressing on. If swelling persists, the same procedure is repeated



however, offer academic scholarships, grants, student loans, and other financial aid.

When John Murray took over as coach in 1980, the team was in the midst of a losing streak. The team reached .500 within two years, and has been improving steadi-Murray has a won-loss record of 74-23 (.763 winning percentage, one of the highest in the active coaching ranks of Division III). His team was undefeated (15-0) in dual meets this year, and placed third in the Division III National Championships. A summary of individual results follows:

Many of Coach Murray's starters are from Section V, including Mike Cronmiller. Mike is a graduate of Edison Tech and Monroe Community College. While at Edison, he placed third in the states at 145 pounds. While at MCC, he was runner-up in the National Junior College Championships. His narrow defeat in the finals was his only loss in his senior year.

Cronmiller's debut with IC came in the Cornell Open, where he stole the 158 pound title with a 3-2 win over the host school's tough Joe Guclardo. Another title followed in the RIT Invitational, where he trashed University of Buffalo star Jim Capone, 11-2. Capone, brother of two-time state kingpin Pete Capone of Watertown, had wrestled in the service for four years before coming to UB.

A month later, Mike grabbed the New York State title from Syracuse's highlytouted Frank Ryan, 5-4. In the course of the season, Mike also contributed to wins over Cornell, Trenton State (ranked first in the nation then), and St. Lawrence, the eventual Div III team champions. His only loss of the season came at the hands of two-time National Champ Karl Monaco of Montclair St. Monaco finished the season ranked ninth in all divisions

At the NCAA Eastern Regionals, Mike beat rugged Curt Jenkins of RIT (and Spencerport), 13-5. Jenkins would later claim the bronze medal in the US Hearing Impaired Olympics (Jenkins' teammate, Chris Madden was runner-up).

In the NCAA Championships, Cronmiller buzzed through three opponents before a painful shoulder injury slowed him against Capone in the semifinals. He eeked out a controversial 1-0 overtime win, but the outlook of victory in the finals against Mark Ambrose of Delaware Valley was dim.

In the finals, Mike fought back from a 5-point deficit to tie the match in regulation. In overtime, his superb conditioning fueled him to a 9-0 romp over a frustrated Ambrose. With a national title and a state title to defend, Mike Cronmiller will be back for an encore performance.

This year, several other Section V wrestlers will be competing for Ithaca College. They include:

This brings the Section V total to eleven wrestlers on a roster which will total about thirty. So, when you get a chance, check out this team. They don't have Gorilla Monsoon or other simians, but they do have national calibre, tough, amateur wrestlers!

City and Don Tabor of St. Edwards of Ohio. He made it to the state finals and surprised himself by winning a referee's decision over John Lamar of Peru (Section 7). By that time, Rick had developed his style of wrestling.

He wrestles like a veteran collegiate competitor. He is tireless, passionless, and merciless. Don't ever look for a sign of emotion from Rick while in action. His poker face would unnerve even Cool Hand Luke. He doesn't complain over questionable calls, nor does he (usually) celebrate over triumphs. All he does is wrestle, scoring numerously on high crotch takedowns, escapes, reversals, and even a few back points here and there. Forget that mat wrestling stuff. This guy would rather knock you down, let you up, and play it again, Sam.

Sadwick combines his immense talents with bulldog tenacity to frustrate opponents. As a senior, he frustrated 38 of them. The only imperfection was a controversial tie with Brighton star Todd Levine at 177 pounds. Despite several close matches, Rick maintained his composure and pulled out every win. He is a control wrestler. While winning by scores of only 6-5 and 5-3 over sectional runner-up Todd Burchard (Sperry's standout wrestler), Rick was not worried. "I was always ahead and in control. Todd never really posed a scoring threat.", says Rick.

Wrestling is an aerobic activity, but with Sadwick, it's an electric activity. He never appears tired. It's as if Hilton coach Al Krotz plugs him into a wall outlet for each match. But is he ever worried? "Of course", says Rick. "Against Lassen, I was nervous because he was so aggressive. He penetrated on me a lot, and almost took me down. No one else this year has done that."

"Winning the states the second time was definitely harder", says Rick. There was a lot more pressure - from opponents, sports writers, fans, and himself. Yet he has proven himself time after time. At the states he beat the second, third, fourth, and fifth placing wrestlers. In last year's meet, he beat T.J. Wright, runner-up at 177 pounds this year and National Greco-Roman champion. And what about Ethan Bosch, Iroquois' (Section 6) 167 pound state champ who pinned his way to the Outstanding Wrestler award? Sadwick beat him too, in the Hilton Clayton Barnard tournament, 4-3. No one else this year touched Bosch.

Amazingly, Sadwick does not lift weights except during the latter part of the season. Nor does he wrestle in the offseason. Instead, he enjoys his time away from the mats. Some of this enjoyment comes by grabbing a funny-shaped ball and running over people who try to run you over. It's called football, and Rick carried that ball 175 times for 1,157 yards (1,707 total yards). He enjoyed himself so much he earned Monroe County Division II Player of the Year. He also ran track, played baseball, and believe it or not, played tennis.

How did he get so good? By starting the season slowly to avoid peaking prematurely. By constantly drilling to perfect his technique. By wrestling each team's toughest guy, whether it's at 155, 167, 177,

or heavyweight. By running in the mornings. By drilling on his mats in the basement. By lifting weights after practice. And by concentrating solely on wrestling during the season. And this whole routine is supervised by Krotz, Hilton's veteran coach.

Sadwick might be considered an anomaly given his stature. He posted a 76-2-2 record the last two years. He won two state titles and numerous other championships. Amateur Wrestling News ranked him the fifth-best 155 pounder in the nation. Clearly, he is the idol of many across the country. Yet his persona is pleasantly unaffected. There is no sign of arrogance or conceit. He is friendly, modest, and personable. His boyish good looks would suggest a modern-day Beaver Cleaver rather than a Dan Gable. You'd almost expect him to be a boy scout and have a paper route.

Rick is now at division I Syracuse University on a full athletic scholarship. He will redshirt this coming year. He may be out of the headlines for awhile, but when Rick Sadwick returns to competition, look for some All-American performances. And probably a National Championship.






