

HHS Red Raiders pull off LCAA double



LeROY — After a perfect 7-0 record in dual meets during the 2005-06 regular season and the Livingston County D-I title that was clinched Tuesday, the Hornell wrestling team made its season twice as nice by winning the Livingston County Athletic Association Tournament Saturday in LeRoy.

Hornell had three of its seven wrestlers in the finals come out on top with county titles and 11 of 13 wrestlers competing in the tournament place in the top five to finish ahead of Letchworth, also the D-I runner-up behind the Red Raiders, by 24 points.

kids," said Hornell coach Matt Sheldon. "They stuck together and were able to win the dual match title and they wrestled real well this weekend. We kind of went flat tonight, but we really wrestled well."

Hornell, which finished with 223 points, won the tournament for the second year in a row and pulled off the double — winning both the Division I regular season dual meet title and the LCAA Tournament — for the second time in four years.

Aaron Parks won the 140pound title over LeRoy's Kory Cosimeno with a pin in 1:57, while teammates Scott Ray and Tyler Sick also won individual titles. Ray defeated Wayland-Cohocton's Adam Mortensen, 2-1, at 130 pounds and Sick defeated Letchworth's Alan Fagan, 11-2, at 152.

Joe Sirianni fell 1-0 to Warsaw's Dakota Stackhouse at 96 pounds and Andy Drake lost 7-4 to Bath-Haverling's Cody Hutcheson at 135 to place second. Ryan Dieter had to default out of the finals because of an injury to his shoulder, giving Letchworth's Joe Hendrickson the win, and Dan Rosemier was pinned in 3:44 to Warsaw's Bill Romasser at 215.

Besides the three first place finishers and four second place finishers, HHS had four others gain podium spots as Adam Dwyer (112), Joe Murray (119) and Austin Dwyer (125) took fourth and Doug Drew (171) was fifth.

"I am real proud of the kids," Sheldon repeated. "We had quite a few of them that picked it up for this tournament. I said before that we had to get some of those other kids to place and we did. That's what you have to do to win

sectionals."

Letchworth finished with 199 points, followed by Warsaw with 197.5 and Haverling at 154.5. Wayland-Cohocton was sixth with 98, Keshequa took seventh with 94.5 and Dansville was 10th with 67.

Hornell will be in Attica next weekend to defend its Class BBBB title, but it's going to be a tough task to accomplish.

"It's going to be tough," said Sheldon. "Pal-Mac, Attica and us will be there battling it out, but if we wrestle like we did this weekend we should have a good shot."
