## C-S Panthers open wrestling season with big win over Avoca

Addison storms back with seven-straight wins to beat Alfred-Almond From staff reports

CAMPBELL — Campbell-Savona opened its wrestling season with an impressive 48-18 victory over Avoca that featured six pins.

In fact, the Panthers (1-0) earned points in every match that was contested on the mat Thursday.


"I was very pleased," said Campbell-Savona head coach Dom Scolaro. "We were very aggressive and we were hitting our moves."

The match began at 145 pounds with Campbell-Savona's Justin Tombs earning a 9-6 decision over Avoca's Micah Fish-Gertz, Tombs jumped out to a 7-1 lead after two periods on the strength of a reversal and near fall in the second period. Fish-Gertz rallied in the third period with a takedown and near fall of his own, but a reversal by Tombs sealed the decision.

The second bout of the night was also a hard-fought decision with the Panthers' Jason Hyer out-pointing Jay Nicholson 12-7. A pair of takedowns and a near fall in the second period helped Hyer out-point his foe 8-1 – providing some cushion before the decision was final.

A pair of forfeit wins by Avoca's Justin Zeh (160 pounds) and Chris Hognoski (171) gave the Tigers a 12-6 lead in the match, but Campbell-Savona was ready to show its strength in the upper weights.

Kaleb Drake began a pinfest with a one minute stop-

from breaking records to not drowning.

"The team's goal is to make every swimmer on this team feel as though he is part of something bigger. Our main goal is to realize what teamwork is about."

Wayland-Cohocton, meanwhile, is taking a different approach to the season. According to Coach Rob Hughes, the Eagles are more concerned with sectionals than they are with the outcome of their regular-season LCAA and non-league meets.

"Our focus this year has been sectionals," Hughes said.
"We're not slowing down for any particular meet or trying to gain an advantage for any meet. We're really training to make some noise in sectionals and we're not going to let up."
