Section V – Scholar / Athlete Wrestling Scholarship

The Deborah G. Oliveri family, in cooperation with the Italian-American Community Center, has established a trust for the purpose of awarding various scholarships to deserving High School wrestling seniors who are planning to pursue a college education. This particular segment of the trust, and group of scholarships, is designed to recognize six young men in Section V, one from each of the six divisions, who have participated and excelled in the sport of interscholastic wrestling.

All applications must adhere to the following criteria:

- 1. Student must be a senior in good standing who is planning on graduating in June 2007 from school within the limits of the Section V athletic region.
- 2. Student must have a cumulative academic average of 87 or above.
- 3. Student must be a varsity wrestler who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in the sport of wrestling and has also demonstrated excellence in leadership and sportsmanship.
- 4. Student plans to continue his education at a 2 year or 4 year college or university during the fall following high school graduation.
- 5. To be considered for this opportunity, all of the above criteria must be submitted by May 15, 2007.

In addition, in regard to the recipient selection process, the coach of the applicant must complete the following:

- 1. Division coaches to submit the names of the students they want to be considered to the wrestling Chair of their own division, along with the student's wrestling achievement record, a letter that speaks to the student's leadership and sportsmanship qualities and an official and certified academic transcript.
- 2. Division Chair forwards the name and records of the individual chosen to the Friends of Wrestling Chairman.

One scholarship each in the amount of \$500 will be awarded to the six (6) individuals chosen by the Division Chair and his or her committee. One from each of the six divisions.

Funds will be disbursed directly to the college or university the student will be attending as soon as official confirmation is received from that Institution that the scholarship recipient has been admitted, enrolled as a full time student and has commenced attendance.

It is also recommended, and this is optional, that each division also submit an alternate student who meets all of the aforementioned criteria.
